## TRAVEL PURPOSE/OUTCOMES

**REPORT OF ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN** (Assessing its value against the specific outcomes identified in the travel application)

- 1. Jointly with the Australian Submarine Agency conduct meetings in the USA with key government and industry organisations, including NAVSEA that will directly inform the NPS workforce capability requirements and approach to capability uplift.
  - Productive meetings conducted with NAVSEA, US Navy Submarine Industrial Base (SIB}, BlueForge Alliance, Hampton Roads Alliance which provided valuable insights into the approach and investments being made in the US in industrial base capacity and capability. DIIS and the Australian Submarine Agency have established a strong partnership to progress industrial base uplift in South Australia.
- 2. To gain detailed insights into the Danville Training Academy that will translate into design of the operating model for the Osborne Skills and Training Academy.
  - Detailed discussions with the Institute for Advanced Learning and Research (IALR) in Danville, including a deep dive into the ATDM model. It was important that DIIS was with the ASA in this deep dive to assist with contextualising the ATDM model for Australian industrial context. Continuing to work with the ASA on the relevance of the Danville model to the STA concept.
- 3. To meet with HII to progress activities under the MoU and gain a detailed understanding of the Newport News Shipyard that strengthens South Australia's relationship with a key industrial partner in the US. It is likely that the activities under the MoU will result in work for South Australian suppliers and a betterinformed approach to skills and training for the NPS.
  - Progressed discussions with HI/ regarding the MoU and the VCS Supplier Capability Uplift Program. It was agreed with HI/ (and the ASA) to progress with a commercial pilot. Potential for announcement when the Premier visit NNS in May 2024.
- Undertake additional meetings and engagements with US based industry to support joint objectives for industrial capability uplift both workforce and supply chain that may result in better informed investments to support capability uplift.
  - Engagements with organisations and SMEs in the US industrial base to understand the approaches, support, and investment in the defence industrial base. Provided insights into potential opportunities for capacity investments in South Australia to support the shipbuilding programs.
